

Musician, director, arranger, and business professional

Bryce is not all about technology. He is a life-long musician. His parents were music teachers, so he grew up playing music from a very young age. He studied piano and trumpet. In college, he earned nearly enough credits for a music minor.

Today Bryce plays trumpet in several professional and community groups. He is also a director and conductor, and music arranger. He has been leading the "Royal Court Brass" since 1970, produced a commercial compact disc of the group, and arranged more than 150 pieces for brass ensemble.

Back to technology for a moment. Bryce was an early adopter of music notation software, has held numerous seminars on the topic, and recently created a series of YouTube videos for the software he uses for his arranging work.

Starting in 2005, Bryce had the opportunity to join the music business industry. He was recruited by some of his music contacts to work in their music companies. Naturally, he used some of his technical skills to create web sites (public and intranet), and digital media, including graphics, audio, and promotional videos. He has also used his business skills to train employees, work as a manager, as well as work in marketing and sales. He is also a staunch advocate of music education programs, both public and private.
